Wyoming Family Law Basics

Course Description: This one hour CLE will cover the basics of Wyoming family law, including divorce, issues surrounding property division, parenting plans, and implications of the Affordable Care Act in domestic relations orders.

Presenter: Dona Playton, Faculty Director, University of Wyoming Family and Child Legal Advocacy Clinic, University of Wyoming College of Law

Speaker Bio: Dona Playton has been practicing family law and advocating for children for over 20 years. She is the Director of the Family and Child Legal Advocacy Clinic, a legal clinic she established in 2002 that allows third-year law students to represent low income clients in legal matters such as divorce, child custody, guardian ad litem appointments, parent representation and domestic violence, sexual assault and stalking cases. She has been teaching at the law school since 1999. She teaches Domestic Violence and the Law and Children and the Law each year, and has taught Family Law several times. She also teaches an experiential learning seminar for her clinical students each semester. She is certified by the National Association of Counsel for Children and the ABA as a Child Welfare Law Specialist and is a trained mediator, including in advanced family law issues. She serves on several statewide committees and boards, including the Children's Justice Project Advisory Council, the Access to Justice Commission, and the Wyoming Trial Lawyers Board.
