The initiative harnesses the power of non-lawyer volunteers to provide crucial guidance and support to self-represented litigants, empowering them to navigate the legal system effectively.

Designed to enhance access to justice and streamline court processes, the Court Navigator Pilot Program is a testament to the Wyoming Judicial Branch's commitment to fairness and justice for all. Recognizing the challenges faced by self-represented litigants, the program aims to mitigate delays, procedural errors, and inefficiencies inherent in navigating the legal process alone.

Trained volunteer court navigators serve as invaluable resources, offering clarity on court proceedings and connecting litigants with essential legal and community services. The program initially focuses on three key categories of cases; protection orders, forcible entry and detainer actions (FED), and domestic relations actions including divorce, custody, and child support.

Operational transparency is paramount, with in-person consultation hours prominently displayed on the Wyoming Judicial Branch's website, encouraging walk-ins during designated times. Additionally, remote assistance via Microsoft Teams ensures accessibility for individuals facing geographical constraints or preferring virtual interactions.

As the program evolves and expands, the Wyoming Judicial Branch remains steadfast in its commitment to ensuring that justice remains accessible to all individuals, regardless of their circumstances.
