

AFFIDAVIT FOR DISTRIBUTION OF PERSONAL PROPERTY
(Under Wyoming Statute 2-1-201)

This form can be used with an Affidavit for Distribution of Personal Property.
This form by itself is not an Affidavit.
It should not be filed or recorded unless it is attached to a signed Affidavit.

The personal property owned by the Decedent is described below.

- Do not write confidential information (including social security numbers) on this form. After you file this form, it will be in the public record, which means anyone could see it.
- Please include a description of the personal property owned by the Decedent at the time of their death, and the approximate values of all personal property owned. Examples of personal property include firearms, jewelry, and furniture. Please also include information about any bank accounts, vehicles, and other interests owned by the Decedent.
- In the column named “Identifying Information,” give a short description.
 - For each money account, include the name of the financial institution (bank, credit union, etc.) and the last four digits of the account number.
 - For each vehicle, include the make, model, and VIN number.
- Important Note: If bank accounts, vehicles, or other interests were jointly owned by the Decedent and another person (for example, if two names were on a title or account), the joint ownership may affect how the property is distributed. This may be true even if there is a Last Will and Testament that says something different.
