Welcome to the Wyoming Judicial Branch's Annual Statistical Report for Fiscal Year 2025. This report provides a comprehensive snapshot of our state's judicial system, highlighting key data and insights that reflect our performance. METHODS


The data in this report is based on criteria focused on case statistics for circuit courts during fiscal year 2025 (July 1, 2024 – June 30, 2025). We employ a statistical model developed by the Court Statistics Project (CSP), which allows for meaningful comparisons of our case statistics with those of other states and national benchmarks.

The CSP model includes over 80 unique case types, which can be complex for high-level analysis and year-to-year comparison. To enhance clarity, we have grouped similar case types into 6 main categories for circuit courts.


These improvements in data collection and reporting methods aim to present a clearer, more relevant view of Wyoming's circuit court activities.

Circuit Court Proportion of Cases by Category FY25




Circuit Court New Filings By Case Category, FY23-FY25
