

Question 1:

How many internal users (i.e., Judicial Officers, Clerks, Court Administrators, etc.) work for the State of Wyoming? The WJB has approximately 300 internal users.

Question 2:

How many Prosecutors are employed throughout the State of Wyoming? The WJB does not have this information.

Question 3:

Total number of cases for 2025? In Fiscal Year 2025, Wyoming's trial courts had approximately one hundred and twenty thousand (120,000) cases. Approximately sixty-two thousand (62,000) were traffic related cases.

Question 4:

What percentage of the total number of cases provided above might contain evidence that would be stored in an EEMS? The WJB estimates that 30% to 35%. Based on these estimates, the WJB anticipates an average of approximately 50 evidence submissions per court each month. Larger courts may experience higher volumes, while smaller rural courts may see fewer, but overall the average is expected to be around 50 submissions per month.

Question 5:

What is the average retention period for admitted evidence for closed cases (i.e., 3 years, etc.)?
